

RAMROD'S MUSINGS

From the Pokey—

Since this is my last "From the Pokey" I'd like to take the time to remind everyone to know the rules, be the rules, and live by the rules.

Don't take anyone's word for what the rules say, look them up yourself. Don't make a call if you don't know the rule and, even if you think you do, look it up so you can show it to people.

Even if a person has been a shooter forever, or has been a club officer, they still could be wrong or not up-to-date on the latest interpretation or clarification.

Get up to date. Stay informed. Knowing the rules and how the game should be played will make the game more fun and exciting for you, and fair to all.

Above all, if you don't think it's right, look it up and, if it's right, live with it. But, if it's wrong, take the appropriate action.

Have fun and see you on the range.

Cowboy Logic— Pulp Western

In 1902, *Owen Wister* published *The Virginian*, a novel that earned, albeit grudgingly, praise from literary critics. In his novel, *Wister* brought together eastern civility and western roughness and implied virility. A combination that appealed to the American audience of the new century. According to *Henry N. Smith*, a critic, *The Virginian*, with its larger-than-life hero, its western landscapes, violence and love story, represented "that last pioneer nobleman, roaming a frontier beyond the dominion of a mother culture in the East, representing both its rebellious runaway sons and its most poignant dream of manhood and freedom."

In 1903, *Andy Adams* published *The Log of a Cowboy*. Critics and audiences alike realized that *Adams* had truly created a story that was different, in fact, far more realistic. For *Adams* was a writer who perhaps knew the cowboy better than anyone else who had previously attempted to write about his culture; first, his stories were partly autobiographical and second, he incorporated others' experiences as much as possible. In *The Log of a Cowboy*, *Adams*, like other writers of his

ilk, exercised considerable literary license; however, *Adams* was extremely concerned with the true details of trail driving. His writing reflected this and appealed to those who sought realism in their cowboy fiction. In his alter books, *Adams* explored other aspects of cowboy life, such as the cowboy penchant for storytelling in *Cattle Brands: A collection of Western Camp-Fire Stories*.

The Log of a Cowboy was a novel; however, it had no plot, but merely consisted of episodic ramblings of cowboys discussing life on the range.

It was a true picture of cowboy life, and centered on a cattle drive from the Rio Grande to northwestern Montana in 1882. Although many criticized the book for being dull, the truth, at least according to *Adams*'s account, was that cowboy life was dull, and, as many critics wrote, *Andy Adams* was simply too true to be good. *Adams*'s premise was that the cowboy deserved the truth, although most writers and readers did not share his concern.


