

To kibitz or not to kibitz...

Our shooter has completed a blazing run on stage two. Now it's time for the counters to do their job. Counter one says "clean," counter two says "clean," counter three says "say I thought he missed that last rifle shot, are you sure he didn't? I mean I saw dirt fly and didn't hear a clang. You guys must have missed it. It should be one miss."

What's wrong with this? Well first of all, the reason we have three counters is to cover the entire stage. In doing this we must have independent counts from all three. Unanimous decisions are not required. Majority rules in counting.

Each and every person counting must relay his or her count without consulting with anyone else.

The only exception I can think of is in the case of an nonempty gun being handed off. The counters should hold their count until an unfired round count can be made and then adjust the count accordingly.

As a posse leader, you should put a stop immediately to any discussions regarding count until the counters have given you their numbers and you have seen them written on the score sheet. Then, if the counters want, they can discuss to their hearts content. Don't let one forceful person take control of the counters.
