REGULATOR ROUNDUP

Belly gun makes it's reappearance at the March match.

Most folks have a belly gun or pocket pistol and don't get the chance to shoot it, so we're reintroducing the gamblers friend at the March and September matches.

We will provide a loaner .22 for those who don't have a pocket pistol.

For those of you who do not know the definition of a pocket pistol, here's the blurb from the SASS handbook.

Pocket Pistols and Derringers

Pocket pistols and Derringers are popular for use in side matches and are occasionally introduced as an additional firearm in main match stages.

- A pocket pistol is a small frame, fixed sight, pre-1900 design revolver having a barrel length of four inches or less. Pocket pistols must be .31 caliber or larger. Model "P" Colts and clones and revolvers with swing out cylinders are specifically not allowed regardless of caliber, frame size, or barrel length. Pocket pistols may not be used as or converted to main match revolvers.

- A Derringer is defined as an external hammer, fixed sight, breech loading or percussion ignition, small frame pre-1900 design firearm having one to four barrels up to three and one half inches long. Derringers must be .22 caliber or larger. The Remington style over/under barrel configuration and the Sharps four-barreled Pepperbox are typical SASS-legal Derringers.

- .22 Magnum ammunition is not allowed.

The ROI class will help you as a shooter to know the rules and how to play the game.

The ROII course will help you if and when you decide you want to be a posse leader and how to recognize potentially bad stages and how to correct them.

Cowboy Logic

Annie Oakley 1869 - 1926

"I was eight years old when I made my first shot," reminisced the legendary sharpshooter **Annie Oakley**, "and I still consider it one of the best shots I ever made." Spotting a squirrel perched on a fence in front of her cabin, she impulsively climbed onto a chair, dragged down a loaded rifle, rested the barrel on a porch rail, and drilled the small animal. Soon, the little girl was regularly putting meat in the family pot.

Phoebe Anne Moses was born in Ohio in 1860. When she was 15, local admirers pitted her against a traveling exhibition sharpshooter named **Frank Butler**. **Annie** out shot **Butler**, who persuaded her to marry him a year later. They formed a vaudeville act and then began touring with **Buffalo Bill Cody's** immensely popular Wild West Show in 1885.

A natural performer and veritable shooting machine, **Oakley** became one of the primary assets of **Cody's** Wild West. She raveled 17 years with **Cody**, who affectionately called her "Little Missie." Audiences regarded her as America's Sweetheart, and **Chief Sitting Bull** nicknamed her "Little Sure Shot".

Offstage **Oakley** devoted herself to exquisite needlework and to reading the Bible. During World War I, **Oakley** and **Butler** toured army camps as instructors and performers.

Americas Sweetheart died in 1926 and **Butler** passed away just three weeks later.

Oakley was not a Westerner and, except for her performance tours, she never experienced the West. However, through her countless exhibitions with **Buffalo Bill's** Wild West and other shows, and later exposure in movies and television, **Annie Oakley** became indelibly identified with the Wild West.

It's that time of year again where your membership dues are due.


Dues need to be paid by March to keep receiving e-mail notification of important developments.


