RAMROD'S MUSINGS

From the Pokey

Cocking and walking, a sure way to Stage DQ.

Pards, we know we're not supposed to cock our rifles or pistols and then walk. But how many of us know what to do with our shotguns.

SASS rules allow us to put shot shells in the chamber and move, but the shotgun **must remain open.**

If you close the action on your shotgun you must remain in that place until the shotgun is made safe again.

This can be done by shooting the shotgun or opening the action.

There is no penalty for moving with an open, loaded shotgun.

Cowboy Logic

The first railroad across the Western Plains, the Rocky Mountains and the Sierras to the Pacific Ocean, was constructed by two companies, the Union Pacific and the Central Pacific Railroads.

The CPRR, working eastward, had 700 miles of track to construct and the UPRR, working westward, had about 1090 miles.

The difficulties faced by the two equalized the differences in mileage.

The CPRR had to climb 7000 feet and blast 14 tunnels while the UPRR had a nearly level way, but had to cross through hostile Indian territory.
