shooting those little bitty cards. You folks better watch this cowboy!



The New Saddle By Hoss



The new saddle, it is like a new car. Some of us don't get to many in a lifetime, but they mean so much when we do. I bought my first new saddle about ten years ago and after ridding it for about 30 minutes I discovered the tree was warped. Got rid of it and went back to my old favorite that was 90+ years old when I first got it. There is just something about a new saddle though, the creak and smell of new leather, knowing that you get to break it in, and especially that no one else has ever ridden it. When I found out that I couldn't ride anymore I got rid of all my old saddles and resigned myself to the fact that I would never ride again. Well, ten years later I found a mule that I can ride safely, you need spurs just to get him to walk, so I bought him and started looking for a new saddle. Romeo and I deserved to start fresh together. So, after buying Romeo I started looking for what would really be my first new saddle. Here is where my story starts.

Scapy Deal and I went to Winter Range. The first day there we took a walk through vendors row. There it was, a brand new custom made, high back with pancake horn, early style saddle. First thing I notice is how proud of this saddle the maker is, \$1,850.00, way out of my price range but maybe he is a trader. For four days we haggle and on the way out to come home, he and I work out a deal that suits both of us. (I took an original 1886 with me in case I

found something to trade for, he now has an 86 and I have a saddle.)

Last week I finally got time to get my new saddle out and do some adjusting. The first thing I needed to do was adjust the stirrup length so I throw it on and climb up. I can see that they need to be let out some but I also notice the stirrups are too narrow. I had to wedge my foot in and could see I would have to change to some wider ones. Well, with my feet firmly wedged in and sitting there thinking about putting another set on that were in the tack room it happened. I felt the saddle start to roll to the right. First thing I do is try to kick my feet out of the stirrups, but this is not happening, remember I said I wedged my feet in them and now I couldn't get them out as I see the ground racing towards me. Very dumb! I am thinking with this osteo skeleton of mine I am going to shatter like cheap glass. Well, I took most of the fall with my elbow and hip and didn't bounce much.

The saddle is OK but I am feeling some major pain. I look up and realize this is the first time I have ever been thrown by a hitch rail. Yeah, a hitch rail. I had put the saddle on my hitch rail just to check out the stirrup length and it throwed me. If my feet had not been stuck I would have been just fine, got the image. When I told my wife Gail what happened she looked at my arm and thought it might be fractured and that I should go get x-rays. Now you realize she said this after first rolling on the floor holding her stomach and laughing hysterically for about 20 minutes. It was after she could breath again and wiped away the tears, that she made the suggestion. I tell her that after seeing her reaction to how I did it I sure as hell didn't want to have to tell the doctor

what happened. After all, it was a long way from my heart and I have healed up from a lot worse without a doctor.

Well, I didn't go to the doctor and finally my wife can walk by me without going into fits of laughter, but I do hear funny sounds from under the covers now and then after we go to bed, and I can move my arm pretty well and the limp is not as bad. I am not sure how long it takes pride to heal, but as soon as I can get up the nerve that hitch rail is mine. I won't give up until I can stay on the full 8 seconds.
